INTRODUCTION BEFORE INSTALLATION...

Installation requires a professional mechanic. In addition to these instructions, professional knowledge of disassembly / reassembly procedures and post installation checks must be known.

PRIOR to beginning, inspect the vehicles steering, driveline, and brake systems, paying close attention to the suspension link arms and bushings, sway bars and bushings, tie rod ends, pitman arm, idler arm, ball joints and wheel bearings. Also check the steering sector-to-frame and all suspension-to-frame attaching points for stress cracks. The overall vehicle must be in excellent working condition; repair or replace all worn parts. Read instructions several times before starting.

Read each step completely as you go.

Be sure you have all needed parts and know where they install.

NOTES:

- Do NOT install this suspension system in conjunction with any other type of aftermarket or fabricated components to gain additional suspension height.
- Front end alignment is necessary.
- Tool and Wrench/Socket size is given in brackets [] after each appropriate step.
- A foot-pound torque reading is given in parenthesis () after each appropriate fastener.
- Prior to attaching components, be sure all mating surfaces are free of grit, grease, excessive undercoating, etc.
- Always wear safety glasses when using power tools.
- A factory service manual should be on hand for reference.

BEFORE YOU DRIVE...

Check all fasteners for proper torque. Check to ensure for adequate clearance between all rotating, mobile, fixed, and heated members. Verify clearance between exhaust and brake lines, fuel lines, fuel tank, floor boards and wiring harness. Check steering components for clearance.

Test and inspect brake system. Perform steering sweep to ensure front brake hoses have adequate slack and do not contact any rotating, mobile or heated members. Inspect rear brake hoses at full extension for adequate slack. Failure to perform hose check/replacement may result in component failure.

Perform head light check and adjustment.

MARNING: It is the ultimate buyer's responsibility to have all bolts / nuts checked for tightness after the first 100 miles and then every 1000 miles. The steering, suspension and driveline systems, plus wheel alignment should be inspected by a qualified professional mechanic at least every 3000 miles.

TECH TIP / TIME SAVER...

• Some minor trimming will be required with certain wheel/ tire combination. This is normal with most aftermarket tire/wheel fitments on Nissan trucks & SUVs. Trimming will normally include the bottom edge of the inner fender shrouds and/or lower corner of front bumper valance. As a rule of thumb, deeper backspacing and shorter/ narrower tires will reduce/eliminate trimming required.

TIRES & WHEELS...

Larger rim and tire combinations may increase leverage on suspension, steering, and related components. When selecting combinations larger than OE, consider the additional stress you could be inducing on the OE and related components.

NOTE: Stock \ Factory 16", 17", 18" & 20" Wheels Will Fit back on the vehicle once this suspension system is installed. Aftermarket Wheels Require 5.25 Inch Back Spacing.

MARNING: ANY larger or wider tire & wheel combination other than listed Will Require Vehicle Trimming.

IMPORTANT DISCLAIMER: The provided tire/wheel fitments are approximate. Actual dimensions of a given tire size can vary considerably from one brand to another. Manufacturers' wheel offset and backspacing measurement points are not always consistent. Backspacing greatly impacts tire-to-fender clearance when turning. Wheel width and backspacing influence whether the tires protrude past the fenders, and to what extent. Considering these important factors, we recommend that you fit-check your tire/wheel selection prior to purchasing.

Lower the vehicle to the ground.

FRONT CLEARANCE CHECK...

15. \(\bigcap \) With the vehicle on the ground, cycle the steering lock-to-lock and check all components for proper operation and clearances. Pay special attention to the clearance between the tires / wheels and knuckles, brake hoses, wiring, etc.



Raise the vehicle back onto jack stands and secure as per **Step 1**. With the suspension 'hanging' at full extension travel, cycle the steering lock-to-lock and check all components for proper operation and clearances. Pay special attention to the clearance between the tires / wheels and knuckles, brake hoses, wiring, etc. Lower the vehicle to the floor.

REAR DISASSEMBLY & ASSEMBLY

NOTE: Save ALL factory components and hardware for reuse, unless noted.

PREPARE VEHICLE...

12. \square Chock the front tires. Position a jack beneath the center of the rear axle of the vehicle. Raise rear of vehicle and place jack stands under the frame rails, a few inches in front of the rear springs' front hangers. Ease the jack down until the frame is resting on the stands. Keep a slight load on the jack. Remove the rear tires.

TECH TIP If the factory spare tires is in place, lower & remove the spare to give you working room.

DISCONNECT ABS LINES FROM AXLE...

13. Disconnect the ABS lines rubber line clips from the metal clips on the rear axle.

DISCONNECT LOWER SHOCK MOUNT...

14. \square Remove shock mounting hardware at lower shock mount. [21mm Wrench] Retain factory hardware.

DISCONNECT EXHAUST HANGER...

15. \square On the Passenger side frame rail, locate the rearmost exhaust hanger. Unbolt exhaust hanger from frame. [13mm]

REMOVE LEAF SPRING REAR SHACKLE...

16. \square At the rear of the leaf spring, locate the rear shackle mount at the frame. Remove shackle bolts from the upper and lower mount. [17mm]

Remove the flat outside shackle plate. Pry out the offset inner shackle mounting bracket.

NOTE: On the Passenger side, pull exhaust over & inward to gain access to remove the inner shackle plate.

INSTALL LEAF SPRING REAR SHACKLE...

17. \square Lower the rear axle with floor jacks to make room for the new, longer shackles.

Locate the (1) 55-02-40048 Shackle Plate, Straight & the (1) 55-03-40048 Shackle Plate, Offset.

Locate Hardware Bag #77-40048. Hardware PER Side: (2) shackle sleeves, (1) 1/2" x 4-1/2" Bolt, Coarse Thread, (1) 1/2" x 5-1/2" Bolt, Coarse Thread, (4) 1/2" Washers & (2) 1/2" Lock Nuts, Coarse Thread

Grease outside of sleeves and insert into factory upper frame mount and the leaf spring eye bushing.

NOTE: Use a Silicone based synthetic water-proof grease.

☐☐ Install a 1/2" washer onto a 1/2" x 5-1/2" bolt. Insert the bolt & washer into the 55-03-40048 Shackle Plate, Offset. Insert the bolt through the factory frame mount sleeve toward the outside of the vehicle. Install the 55-02-40048 Shackle Plate, Straight. Install the 1/2" washer and 1/2" lock nut. Hand tighten at this time.

☐☐ Install a 1/2" washer onto a 1/2" x 4-1/2" bolt. Insert the bolt & washer in the same direction as the upper frame mount through the lower leaf spring mount. Install the 1/2" washer and 1/2" lock nut. Hand tighten at this time.



NOTE: On the Passenger side, pull exhaust over & inward to gain access to install shackles.

RECONNECT EXHAUST HANGER...

18. \square On the Passenger side frame rail, reconnect exhaust hanger bracket to frame. [13mm]

RECONNECT LOWER SHOCK MOUNT...

19. \square Raise the rear axle to reinstall factory shock mounting hardware at lower shock mount. [21mm]

RECONNECT ABS LINES FROM AXLE...

20. \square Reconnect the ABS lines rubber line clips to the metal clips on the rear axle.



22. ☐☐ With the vehicle sitting on the ground, tighten the rear shackles at the upper frame and the lower leaf spring mounts. [3/4"] ☐ Raise spare tire into original position.



FINAL CHECKS

CLEARANCE CHECK...

With the vehicle on the ground, check all components for proper operation and clearances. Pay special attention to the clearance between the tires / wheels, brake hoses, wiring, etc. Check tire/wheel clearance with the fenders/bumper as well as with the steering knuckle. NOTE: Depending on your choice of tire size and wheel width, it is not uncommon to trim the lower plastic valance of the bumper and inner fender shroud slightly to add proper tire clearance while turning.

WHEEL ALIGNMENT...

24. Realign vehicle to factory OEM specifications. It is necessary to have a proper and professional wheel alignment performed by a certified alignment technician. It is recommended that your vehicle alignment be checked after any off-road driving.

HEADLIGHTS...

25. Re-adjust headlights to proper setting. In addition to your vehicle alignment, for your safety and others, it is necessary to check and adjust your vehicle head lamps for proper aim and alignment.

FOUR WHEEL DRIVE...

26. Activate the four wheel drive system and check for proper engagement.

SUPERLIFT WARNING DECAL...

27. Install the **WARNING TO DRIVER** decal on the inside of the windshield, sun visor or on the dash, within Driver's view.

Generally, braking performance and capabilities are decreased when significantly larger / heavier tires and wheels are used. Take this into consideration while driving.
