




INSTALLATION INSTRUCTIONS


1. With a phillip's screwdriver and 7mm wrench, remove wheel well liner retaining hardware. **See Photo 1.**
2. With a paint marker, mark steering shaft . **See Photo 2.**





3. With 10mm wrench, remove steering pinch bolt. **See Photo 3.**
4. Using 18mm wrench, remove upper ball joint nut. **See Photo 4.**





5. With a 24mm and 21mm wrench, remove the control arm bolt. **See Photo 5.**
6. Place spacer on inside of control arm and replace control arm bolt. **See Photo 6.**



7. Note the spacer locations. See **Photo 7**.
8. Insure paint marks are aligned and reinstall steering pinch bolt with 10mm wrench. See **Photo 8**.



9. Install ball joint nut on bottom of ball joint using 18mm wrench. See **Photo 9**.
10. Reinstall wheel well liner. See **Photo 10**.



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
